Example of Niomre

In collaboration with the Senegalese Ministry of Health, BLUMORPHO is addressing urgent healthcare needs in Niomré, a region in northwest Senegal which has only **one health center with no doctors** (only a nurse and a midwife) and **unreliable electricity**. Our teams are also exploring collaboration opportunities in other countries, including Togo

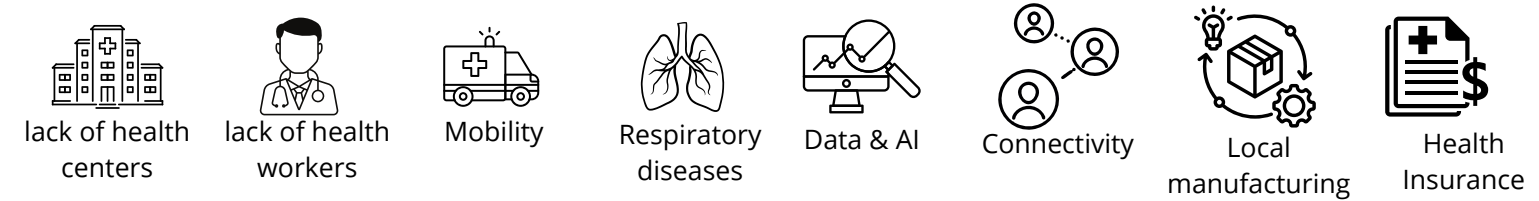
